The Meeting Minutes

From the meeting May 15th, 2001

The meeting was held at Ventura County Fire Department and hosted by Steve McClellan.

Jeff Fehlberg of Heartland Fire, gave an excellent presentation on the two school shooting incidents his agency recently experienced.

The Secretary's Report:

The March meeting minutes were approved as written on a motion made by Jason DeVita and seconded by Darryl Polk.

Secretary Gary Stevens advised that in an effort to clean up and update the mailing list, the meeting minutes are only being sent to those members that have paid their dues.

Secretary Stevens also advised that he has compiled an email list for members to facilitate sending out the minutes in a faster manner.

The Treasurer's Report:

Balance: \$5430.96.

In the absence of Treasurer Susan Wysong, President Steve McClellan presented the treasurer's report.

The Treasurer's report was accepted on a motion made by Don Wise and seconded by Jason DeVita.

Training:

Heartland Fire is looking into hosting an EMD class in either August or September.

Discussion was held with regards to Cal Chiefs sponsoring a PSTC class on School Violence. A motion was made by Steve McClellan and seconded by Don Wise to have Cal Chiefs sponsor the class possibly in September near the start of school. Steve McClellan will contact PSTC and report back at the July meeting.

Anna Olivarez of Santa Ana Fire is still soliciting ideas for a "Tech Talk for Dispatchers" class.

New Business

Darryl Polk , (Ontario Fire) advised that the Department of Transportation would like to make EMD a required certificate for dispatchers. Currently Ontario FD is working with Corona FD to make EMD POST reimbursable.

Old Business:

Don Wise, (Verdugo Fire) presented information on the status of two bills making their way through the state legislature. The bills are SB695 and AB616.

SB695 has been met with some opposition by members of PORAC. SB695 deals with reclassifying dispatchers as Public Safety members through PERS and not in the miscellaneous category.

AB616 deals with retirement issues only and opens up new options for retirement ie: 2% @ 50, 2.5% @ 55 and 3% @ 60.

Steve McClellan will talk to Virginia Ferral of Cal Chiefs North and Lorrie Camden of Sebastopol PD/FD to see what will need to be done in the future in regards to support of the bills.

Stay tuned for more information on these two very important bills.

Steve McClellan will also check with Northern section to see where they are on state certification for fire dispatchers.

Committee Report:

Jeff Fehlberg reported that the Marketing Subcommittee has not met recently and had nothing new to report.

Northern Update:

No Report.

Round Table:

Gary Stevens, (South Bay Regional Communications) – Work progressing on the new center, currently fully staffed. Have signed contract for a new Tiburon CAD system to go online when the new building is complete. With the new building, will also be including new radios and MDT/MDC's.

Darryl Polk, (Ontario Police/Fire) – Will be moving into a new facility in the next 18 to 24 months. Currently looking at a new Tiburon CAD system. Are down 6 positions and currently recruiting at college job fairs for dispatchers.

Walt Moulton, (Kern County/Bakersfield Fire) – They are currently fully staffed by 5 supervisors and 17 dispatchers handling around 54,000 calls per year. Dispatcher utilize the Clausen system of EMD. Staffing for the dispatch center is 1 supervisor and 4 dispatchers on days and 1 supervisor and 3 dispatchers on nights.

Steve McClellan, (Ventura Co. Fire) – Since Ventura started dispatching for AMR ambulances, the call volume in the center Has went up nearly 2 fold. Dispatchers currently are in negotiations, they are looking at expanding their facility, rebuilding the radio infrastructure and putting together a needs analysis & RFP for a new CAD system. Dispatchers are currently working 24 hour shifts and they will have 8 openings as of 7/1/01.

Jeff Fehlberg, (Heartland Fire) - Advised that they will be taking over dispatching for Chula Vista. This will add approximately 12,000 calls for service to their dispatch center. Jeff advised that Chula Vista will be joining into their JPA.

Don Wise, (Verdugo Fire) - Verdugo is currently in the process of replacing their microwave system and radio backbone. This will include the placement of new receiver sites throughout the San Gabriel Valley cities that Verdugo dispatches for. Verdugo has finished upgrading their workstations to Dell PC's using PRC CAD with a Windows 98 emulation. To handle the ever changing need to keep changing their network passwords, Verdugo has installed biometric fingerprint scanners. Instead of having to change their passwords every 90 days or so, they simply place a fingertip on the scanner and they are logged onto the system. Verdugo currently has 2 openings, 1 for Fire Communications Shift Supervisor and 1 for Fire Communications Operator. Verdugo is currently in the process of negotiations with the City of Glendale. Anyone interested in a salary comparison can email Don directly for the numbers.
