The Meeting Minutes

From the meeting March 13th, 2001

The meeting was held at South Bay Regional Public Communications Authority in Hawthorne and hosted by Gary Stevens.

The Secretary's Report:

The January meeting minutes were approved as presented on a motion made by Jason DeVita and seconded by Chuck Alexander,

July 10th Cal Chief's Meeting, Susan Wysong is looking at offering a "Legal Issues for Dispatch Centers" class in conjunction with the meeting.

New Business

Steve Holtrust (Ontario Fire) advised the group that Cal Chiefs had sent an email looking at the possibility of including Information Technology in the Communications section or creating a new section with in Cal Chiefs. The consensus was to create a new section.

Discussion was held with regards to NENA coming up with the standard for GIS Phase II. Although the state will reimburse agencies for equipment to upgrade to Phase II, they will not pay for the additional staffing needed.

Old Business:

Jason DeVita (South Bay Communications) presented the design for the groups web site. Jason selected OLM Services to host the web site. Our new web site address is: www.CalChiefsSouth.org.

Gary Stevens (South Bay Communications) advised that he has been in contact with Lorrie Camden of Sebastopol Police Dept. who has been spearheading a campaign for dispatcher retirement of 2% at 50. As of yet, she has not forwarded any information or preliminary assembly bill.

Susan Wysong (North County Fire) presented Chuck Alexander with a plaque for his past service to Cal Chiefs South as Vice-President and President

Round Table:

Gary Stevens, (South Bay Regional Communications) – Looking at both Motorola and Orbacom radio consoles for the new dispatch center. Work progressing on the new center, currently fully staffed.

Steve Holtrust, (Ontario Police/Fire) – Have finished installing Motorola radio consoles at all positions. Ontario is currently using a Motorola trunked radio system.

Denny Neville (Rancho Santa Fe Fire) asked if anyone was selected to be on the APCO36 committee. Apparently APCO has been overwhelmed with requests to be on the committee. Denny also inquired if anyone had come up with a good solution for multi-agency incidents

where assisting agencies are on different radio bands and unable to talk to each other.

Chuck Alexander (Heartland Fire) advised that their GEAC CAD had been upgraded on 2/6/01 and that it was working well. Heartland is currently in negotiations with Chula Vista to provide their dispatch services. Chula Vista will add approximately 35,000 calls for service per year. Looking at hiring an additional 4 line supervisors. Heartland was the agency that handled the fire dispatching for the Santana School shooting in Santee. That they had difficulties in getting air ambulances.
